



Off Road Derby Event Specifications

Entry Fee: \$25/Class

Event Coordinators: Joe Kaster

Sign-Up Time: Begins 3 Hours before Event (Check Fair Schedule for Official Times).

Prizes: (See Pit Handbook for Prize Schedule).

Registration: Entry form with signed liability waiver and entry fee must be submitted to the Event Coordinator on the day of the Event.

In the interest of safety, anyone entering is subject to and shall obey the following along with the rules and regulations of the Baraga County Fair Pit Event Handbook.

Off Road Derby Event Rules

Each Driver is allowed up to 3 crew members.

Number of vehicles per heat and laps will be determined by number of entries.

CAR/TRUCK REGULATIONS: Any two wheel drive front engine, hard top automobile, is allowed. No four-wheel drive vehicles, must have driveshaft removed.

GLASS/CHROME: All glass, including headlights, taillights, mirrors, etc. shall be removed. The front windshield is optional, but if it is removed, must have no larger than 1/4 inch screen to protect drivers. Screen must be used in place of sunroof.

Vehicles shall be swept clean, all glass removed, including door panels. All decorative chrome striping or molding, antenna, luggage racks, and any other dangerous loose objects shall be removed from outside of the vehicle. NOTE: This work shall be done prior to entering the fairground.

BUMPERS: No special bumpers, only stock/factory bumpers. Bumpers must extend width of car.

PAINT: Both front door panels SHALL be painted white.

Cutting fenders- for wheel clearance only- is permissible.

ROLL BARS: All vehicles will have mandatory roll bar behind driver seat and must be minimum 1-1/2" pipe 1/8" minimum wall, or 2" x 2" x 1/8" square tubing. 2 horizontal bars, top and bottom behind driver seat with 2 verticals 12 inches apart. Welding pipe top and bottom, solid lengths, not pieces welded. Roll bars must have a minimum mounting plate of 8x8 top & bottom.

DRIVER INFO/RULES: Drivers maneuver around the track in a forward direction. Bumping and rubbing is permitted, but no intentional hits. Deliberate acts will lead to disqualification.

After lead vehicle finishes, all vehicles should cross finish line if possible.

Driver must keep arms inside vehicle during race.

No passengers allowed.

No intentional engine revving/racing after disqualification or end of the heat. This does not include the victory lap for the derby winner.

Driver's side window opening must have window netting to protect driver arms going out in the event of a roll over - NO exceptions.

Do not leave vehicle unless told by race steward and red flag has been displayed or the last vehicle has stopped and given the checkered flag. If you leave vehicle without permission, you may be disqualified.

Any driver/vehicle leaving competition area during heat will be disqualified including driving up or going beyond boundary markers intentionally.

In the event of a rollover, the derby shall be stopped while the vehicle is righted. A vehicle that rolls over is disqualified unless, after Pit Director inspection, it is deemed safe to continue.

In the event of a fire, the race will be stopped, the driver shall get out, and the vehicle will be disqualified. The race will then be restarted. An ABC fire extinguisher is allowed, but not required, and shall be mounted within reach of driver.

DOORS: Driver's door shall be secured for race. It may be fastened by stout, small chain or a removed seat belt strap. The seat belt method is preferred as it makes for quick release. This helps us get injured drivers out of a vehicle or in case of fire. Driver's door strongly recommended to be reinforced to prevent injury. Window net on driver's door is mandatory. Net or screen may be used and attached with nylon zip ties or securely attached to vehicle. All other doors shall be fastened shut by chain, straps, or welding. Any tailgates shall be chained, bolted or welded so gate will not come open during a heat.

BATTERIES: Batteries can remain factory, if moved, must be to a reasonable position inside the

vehicle. They shall be securely fastened and shall be covered with a suitable secured shield.

TIRES: DOT-certified tires only.

BRAKES: Vehicles shall have working brakes before the beginning of their heat.

TRUNK LIDS: Trunk lids shall be fastened so as not to spring up and impair driver view. A minimum 6"x6" hole must be cut and chained closed.

HOODS: Must have at least 6"x6" hole cut and chained closed but not welded. Hood may not be bolted shut.

GAS TANK: Can be left factory. If altering, the following rules apply: Any approved gas container may be used, not to exceed 6.6 gallon size. A metal tank is preferred (example: portable boat tank or lawn mower tank, fuel cells). All tanks shall be sealed. No gas leaks allowed. Any vehicle visibly leaking fuel shall be disqualified. If moved, it must be firmly secured, and an appropriate firewall shall be placed between the fuel tank and the driver.

Electric fuel pump must have labeled on-off switch within driver's reach unless stock pump is used.

Any driver or crew member not following the rules will cause their vehicle to be disqualified.

A heat winner shall drive the same vehicle in the feature heat that they drove in their winning heat.

Additional safety regulations or rules may be imposed at the time of derby to conform with track conditions, or unforeseen circumstances.

All vehicles shall be removed from grounds within 24 hours, or they shall be considered abandoned.

All derby judge rulings are final.
